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CDL Physical And Medical Requirements | DMV.com

A DOT physical exam is valid for up to 24 months. The medical examiner may also issue a medical examiner's certificate for less than 24 months when it is desirable to monitor a condition, such as high blood pressure.

Driver Qualification FAQs | DOT Medical Card & Physical ...

Regulations allow for anyone with blood pressure lower than 140/90 to qualify for a two-year medical certificate. If the blood pressure is 140-159/90-99 the medical certificate is only good for one year. If blood pressure is any higher, medication or other forms of control may be needed before a DOT physical card can be given.

You must have a valid Medical Examiner's Certificate (DOT card), or a photographic copy of your valid Certificate, to receive a CDL or CLP.

Any individual with a physical or mental injury or disease which has impaired his/her ability to perform normal duties must have a physical examination and obtain a new medical examiner's certificate/DOT medical card. However, if returning from medical leave, a new physical is not necessarily required unless the employer questions the individual's abilities to perform his/her job duties.

QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE FOR DOT PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS

According to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA), if you are a CMV driver, you must undergo a DOT physical conducted by a certified medical examiner and receive a medical examiner's certificate (MEC) – also called a DOT health card. Without a valid DOT health card, you can lose your CDL.

Blood Pressure: DOT Physical - Minimum Requirements And Advice

The basic requirements for passing a DOT physical exam are: Vision in both eyes, as well as each eye individually, need to be 20/40, with visual improvement devices, such as glasses or contacts permitted. Must be capable of distinguishing colors found on traffic signals. Should be able to perceive a forced whisper at a distance of at least 5 feet.

The DOT has issued guidelines on high blood pressure/hypertension, and what steps should be taken to control the condition and determine if you will be allowed behind the wheel. There is strong evidence that hypertension drastically increases the risk of heart disease and that effective treatment reduces cardiovascular illness and death.

Stage 2 - BP 160-179/100-109 Certification Period 3 months as one time certification. Within the 3 months, if the blood pressure is below 140/90, the driver may receive 1 year certification. Stage 3 - BP Reading >180/110 Disqualified. When the blood pressure is less than 140/90, the driver can be certified at 6 month intervals.

DOT CDL Physical Exam Physicians Instructions

Note that the CDL physical and medical requirements for a commercial driver's license are regulated by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT). Due to the strict DOT physical requirements, commercial operators are generally required to pass the CDL physical exam on a regular basis.

DOT medical guidelines outline the health criteria that commercial vehicle drivers must meet to qualify for certification. One health condition that is closely reviewed by the DOT is diabetes. Individuals with known or suspected diabetes are required to provide specific medical information to the DOT-certifying physician regarding diabetic control.

Frequently Asked Questions – DOT Physical Requirements

In order to drive a commercial vehicle in the U.S. with a maximum gross vehicle weight rating of over 10,000 lbs in interstate commerce, drivers are required to pass a physical examination given by a DOT-approved medical examiner to obtain and maintain a medical examiner's certificate.

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
